Traffic & Congestion

Lane shifts, closures and detours should be expected during construction.

Traffic updates and maps will be provided in advance online at OakHillParkway.com.

What we are doing:

- Limiting daytime lane closures on US 290 and SH 71.
- Communicating closures and detours to the public in advance.
- Providing signage for detours and driveway access changes.

What you can do:

- Sign-up for weekly lane closure alerts at OakHillParkway.com/connect/updates.
- Plan your travel ahead of time using free digital navigation tools.
- Use alternative routes to avoid heavy construction areas.



Safety Tips for Driving in Construction Work Zones



1. Slow down.
2. Be aware of speed limit changes.
3. Obey construction signage.
4. Keep more space between vehicles.
5. Limit distractions, such as cell phones.
6. Build-in extra travel time.
7. Watch out for construction work crews.
8. Merge before reaching a lane closure.
9. Drive defensively, not offensively.

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Noise, Dust & Lighting

Construction projects can be disruptive, and we will do our best to be a good neighbor.

Residents should expect construction activities that cause potential noise and dust to take place during the day, at night and on the weekends.

What we are doing:

- Using non-intrusive white noise reverse signal alarms on most equipment at night.
- Performing concrete surfacing and grinding activities only during the day.
- Directing construction lights away from residential areas.
- Watering active construction areas to reduce dust.
- Driving slowly in work zones to reduce dust.

What you can do:

- Use earplugs or a white noise machine.
- Seal all windows/doors to prevent noise from entering through openings.
- Plant tall, leafy shrubs outside to provide an additional barrier.
- Use sound-proof/blackout curtains to help block noise and light.
- Install screens on windows and porches to help block dust.
- Regularly change your air filters.

What activities could generate noise?

Running of engines and generators

Loading and unloading of large trucks

Heavy machinery use

Rock trenching, milling and excavation

Concrete/asphalt paving and finishing

Jackhammering/Pavement Sawing

Hydraulic Hammering/Hoerammig

Drilling for bridge foundations

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
